

This Month's Policy Summary: Safeguarding and Child Protection


Safeguarding is promoting the welfare of children and Child Protection is defined as:

The activity that is undertaken to protect specific children who are suffering or likely to suffer

significant harm.

• Taking action to enable all children to have the best outcomes.

Safeguarding is everyone's responsibility: for services to be effective each professional organisation should play their full part with a child-centred approach. For services to be effective they should be based on a clear understanding of the needs and views of children. Training Depot Day Nursery works closely with parents.
Our 'A – Z' folder has a written plan in place that has clear and agreed procedures to protect a child. This folder is also reviewed every other month to ensure all actions are followed through and all cases are discussed. If any concerns are raised then the Luton Safeguarding Policy and Procedures will be followed and a referral will be made.
Children's attendance is monitored (see Attendance policy). All home accidents are logged onto our Safeguarding forms and parents will be asked to sign it. Any unexplained injuries which cause concerns will be discussed with the MASH team to seek advice. Any burns will be reported to MASH straight away, and advice will be sort and will be followed.



Baby Massage – January 20th at 10am

One of our parents has offered to run a baby massage session for any of our parents with new babies. She is a qualified infant massage instructor and also works at the hospital as a midwife. Baby massage has many benefits for both parents and babies including bonding, relaxation, improving sleep, improving confidence, and helping to relieve common baby ailments like wind, colic, constipation and teething symptoms.

The session will be suitable for any babies over 6 weeks until they are crawling. It will run for 1 hour. Please let our office staff know if you would like to attend.
